Our Curriculum

Maths:

EYFS:

The children will be starting the term by building on their counting skills. The children will be recapping their learning from last term by consolidating their learning counting to and beyond 20. We will be using pictorial, concrete and written resources to help further the children's understanding and recognition of their numbers to 20 and beyond.

After our counting adventure, the children will move onto working on adding and taking away.

The children will finish the term by exploring 2-D and 3-D shapes. The children will be learning to rotate, manipulate and recognise 2-D and 3-D shapes. They will also be using 2-D shapes to compose pictures and tangrams.

Year 1 and 2:

The children will begin the term by recapping fractions from last term. The children will learn to identify different fractions and split an amount into the equal parts required to make a fraction. The children will begin to look at equivalent fractions and counting in fractions up to a whole. The children will finish the term by exploring time. The children will start by exploring the days of the week and the months of the year. They will then continue to move onto the times represented on a clock and time problems.

Times tables :

This year, we will continue to focus on times tables. It was a government expectation that by the end of Year 2, all children should know their times table and division facts for the 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables. To continue to support the children with their times tables they will be singing songs and doing times table focused activities as part of their Maths lessons.

Throughout the year, the children will continue to be tested on their times tables to further boost/secure their knowledge and also give them an opportunity to earn their times tables certificates.

English:

EYFS:

As part of our whole school Writing project, EYFS will start the term by looking at the Gruffalo. The children will be learning about adjectives and nouns and describing the Gruffalo and his forest.

The children will then move on to explore books based on their topic, Grow. The children will be reading and exploring 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar', 'Jack and the Beanstalk', and 'Oliver's Vegetables'. The children will be focusing on sentence writing this term.

Year 1 and 2:

As part of our whole school Writing project, Year 1 & 2 will start the term by looking at the Gruffalo. The children will be making character and setting descriptions to share with the whole school.

We will finish the term by writing to inform and writing a recount from a historical figure.

Phonics:

Phonics lessons will take place twice a day for all children within the class. The children will be learning new sounds along with consolidating and recapping old sounds.

Spelling Shed:

To help develop the children's spelling, we use Spelling Shed. This program has fantastic games/resources to help the children practice their weekly spellings. Weekly spellings are set for children in Year 1 and 2. The children will be given assignments every week based on a spelling rule and will then be tested in class on that rule the following week.

Science

EYFS:

This term, as part of their topic, the children will be looking at planting and growing. The children will be planting seeds and observing the plants as they grow. The children will make simple observations of the plant, i.e., size and shape. They will then comment on what they notice as the plant changes over time.

Year 1 and 2:

In Science the children will be building on their knowledge of living things and their habitats. We will be discussing what is a living and not living thing. We will also be exploring habitats for plants and animals and what features the animals and plants require to make it a suitable environment for them.

Geography:

EYFS:

This term, EYFS will be looking at animals and where they live. The children will explore which animals below in which habitats, what makes a suitable habitat for this animal and why some animals live in the dark.

History:

Year 1 and 2:

Our History topic for this term is Voyage of Discovery. The children will discover the local links to historical voyages of exploration with links to Matthew Flinders and Joseph Banks.

Homework

Homework will be set on a Friday and is due in the following Wednesday. The homework is always fully explained to the children and often recaps things they have been learning in class. The children will be sent home with a copy of the pick and mix grid which has the homework for the term on (this is also available on the school's website). Water Bottles

Please ensure that water bottles contain only water as squash and fizzy drinks are not permitted in the classroom. We also ask that all water bottles are named so the children can easily identify theirs and that they are plastic. Glass bottles are not permitted in school.
