## Our Curriculum

### Maths:

In maths this term the children will be learning about:

- Addition and subtraction (within 100) - Year 1&2
- Multiplication and division - Year 1&2
- Exploring 3D shapes - EYFS
- 20 and beyond - EYFS
- Basic number sentences - EYFS

### English:

In English this term the Year 1 and 2 children will be writing diary entries, retelling stories and reports, focussing on the class texts, You Wouldn't Want to Be in the Great Fire of London, Toby and the Great Fire of London and Vlad and the Great Fire of London. The children will be writing their own reports, diary entries and a short narrative. We will be looking at the structure of these styles of writing with particular focus on tenses, conjunctions, nouns and verbs.

EYFS children will be looking at a series of different books, where they will explore the structures of narratives, making predictions on stories, labelling and exploring adjectives. We

will do this via our class texts of Mr Wolf's Pancakes, Handa's Surprise, The Tiger that Came to Tea and We're going on an egg hunt.

## **Science**

In Year 1 and 2, the children will continue learning about animals, including humans. They will explore the following areas:

- Notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults.
- Find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air).
- Describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene

In EYFS, we will be exploring our understanding of the world and looking at different habitats. We will be looking at different animals and where they live, creating our own habitats for creatures in our local area.

## **History**

For Year 1 and 2 children, our topic for the term is The Great Fire of London. The children will be learning about:

- What was the Great Fire of London?
- When did it happen?
- What was life like in the 17th Century compared to now?
- How did the fire change London?
- Why do we know about the Great Fire of London

In EYFS, we will be looking at Understanding the World. The topics will include:

- Shrove Tuesday
- Mothers day
- Easter
- Animals and their habitats

### Boom Reader

### Homework

Homework will be set on a Friday and is due in the following Wednesday. The homework is always fully explained to the children and often recaps things they have been learning in class. The children will be sent home with a copy of the pick and mix grid which has the homework for the term on (this is also available on the school's website). ### Water Bottles

Please ensure that water bottles contain only water as squash and fizzy drinks are not permitted in the classroom. We also ask that all water bottles are named so the children can easily identify theirs and that they are plastic. Glass bottles are not permitted in school.

### PlusPay

### MyEd
