Our Curriculum

Maths:

In maths this term the children will be learning about:

- Using arrays to multiply
- 2,5 and 10 times tables, division facts and link them.
- 4 and 8 times tables, division facts and links between them.
- 3, 6 and 9 times tables, division facts and links between them.
- Multiplying by 1 and 0
- Dividing by 1 and 0

Times tables:

This year, we will continue to focus on times tables. It was a government expectation that by the end of Year 4, all children should know their times table and division facts up to and including 12 x 12. To continue to support the children with their times tables they will be singing songs and doing times table focused activities as part of their Maths lessons.

Throughout the year, the children will continue to be tested on their times tables to further boost/secure their knowledge and also give them an opportunity to earn their times tables certificates.

English:

In English this term the children will be writing to inform, focussing on the class text, Stone Age boy. The children will be writing a non-chronological report about what life was like in the Stone Ages. They will be focussing on sentences structure, conjunctions and noun phrases to add detail to their sentences, and as writing in coherent paragraphs. The children will then be moving onto the class text, The Grinch. This will consist of the children writing a comic strip, focussing on speech and prepositions.

To help develop the children's spelling, we use Spelling Shed. This program has fantastic games/resources to help the children practice their weekly spellings. The children will be given assignments every week based on a spelling rule and will then be tested in class on that rule the following week.

Science

In Science the children will be learning about Stats of Matter

- . The children will be learning about:
 - What are solids, liquids and gases?
 - Do all liquids behave the same?
 - How do materials change state?
 - What is the water cycle?
 - Do all liquids evaporate?

History:

Our Geography topic for the term is Stone Age to Iron Age. The children will be learning about:

- To construct a basic timeline to sequence events
- To know that Britain was once covered in ice
- To know how to use a case study of an excavation
- To know how to make deductions from evidence about the lifestyle of Stone Age man
- To know how to use appropriate language to describe the change in lifestyle over time
- To know that some recent discoveries are changing the way we think about the Stone Age
- To know how to identify evidence and artefacts that can be used to explain how life changed in the Iron Age
- To know about the relationship between a physical environment, land use and settlement/trade patterns.

Homework

Homework will be set on a Friday and is due in the following Wednesday. The homework is always fully explained to the children and often recaps things they have been learning in class. The children will be sent home with a copy of the pick and mix grid which has the homework for the term on (this is also available on the school's website). Water Bottles

Please ensure that water bottles contain only water as squash and fizzy drinks are not permitted in the classroom. We also ask that all water bottles are named so the children can easily identify theirs and that they are plastic. Glass bottles are not permitted in school.

PlusPay
