Our learners gain an understanding of **Tolerance of different faiths** and beliefs through...

- Providing them with opportunities to understand different faiths both as part of our RE curriculum and beyond, e.g. Religious Festival Celebrations (Diwali & Holi workshops).
- Challenging Prejudice, e.g. Working with individual students who may say/do things which some deem unacceptable in order that they understand why their actions are wrong.
- Providing opportunities for them to exploring cultural differences, e.g. Spanish Day, Diwali dance workshop.
- Promoting world faiths and other cultures within our Assembly Programme (See Assembly Overview)
- Direct teaching of Diversity through our PHSE Programme, e.g. LBTQ+ Awareness in Y6.
- A curriculum which includes cultural appreciation, e.g. in English through text choice and Music / Art through the study of other cultures.
